More Than 100 Young Children Suffered Seizures After COVID Vaccination: Study

More than 100 young children suffered seizures after receiving a COVID-19 vaccine, according to a new study.

One hundred and four children under 6 years old suffered a seizure within 42 days of a COVID-19 shot, researchers with the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and other institutions found.

Others suffered strokes, blood clotting disorders, and appendicitis, the researchers said.

They analyzed health records from the Vaccine Safety Datalink, a CDC-funded network that features sites operated by Kaiser Permanente, Marshfield Clinic, Health Partners, and Denver Health.

The researchers examined events that fit one or more of 23 prespecified outcomes, including seizures and myocarditis, a form of heart inflammation, following messenger RNA COVID-19 vaccination.

The Pfizer and Moderna COVID-19 vaccines both utilize messenger RNA technology.

Children were studied if they received a vaccine dose from June 18, 2022, to March 18, 2023; 247,011 doses were administered to children under 6 during that time. Researchers examined the events that occurred within 42 days of vaccination.

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration first <u>authorized</u> Pfizer's vaccine for children younger than five and Moderna's vaccine for children younger than six on June 17, 2022, despite efficacy estimates against infection being <u>substandard</u> or <u>unreliable</u> and there being no or <u>negative</u> evidence of protection against severe disease. The study was published by Pediatrics, the American Academy of Pediatrics journal, on June 6.

Type of Analysis

Eric Weintraub of the CDC and the other researchers for the new study conducted a type of examination called rapid cycle analysis. It involves comparing outcomes among the vaccinated within 21 days of a shot with outcomes among the vaccinated between 22 and 42 days of a shot. Events on the same day as vaccination were excluded.

The first window of time—1 to 21 days—is described as the "primary risk interval," or the most likely period of time for the vaccinated to suffer adverse events. The latter time period was deemed a comparison interval. The idea for the events that occur in the latter period is that "it's too late for them to be associated with a vaccine," Dr. William Schaffner, a professor of preventative medicine at Vanderbilt University who was not involved in the study but who has worked closely with the CDC, told The Epoch Times.

The researchers did not compare the vaccinated with the unvaccinated, despite indicating they would do so in the protocol (pdf) for Vaccine Safety Datalink monitoring. They have in some other studies. A request for comment to the corresponding author returned with an away message, and another author did not respond to an inquiry.

The researchers reviewed medical records for each case identified in either of the intervals, and also calculated rates to see whether any were more common in the earlier window.

What They Found

Market Market

In absolute terms, researchers found a number of serious problems after vaccination, including the seizures. The following events were detected in at least one young child one to 42 days following vaccination:

- Guillain-Barre syndrome
- Immune thrombocytopenia

- Venous thromboembolism

The numbers were also higher in the initial window of time for some outcomes.

In the first 21 days, for instance, 38 Pfizer recipients experienced seizures and 23 Moderna recipients experienced seizures. In the second window, 24 Pfizer recipients experienced seizures and 19 Moderna recipients experienced seizures.

Former Georgia football player dies suddenly at 34

The <u>Georgia</u> football family is mourning the loss of former Bulldogs linebacker Akeem Hebron, who died unexpectedly over the weekend, as several of his friends and the football program all confirmed. "Our hearts are heavy as we mourn the loss of a beloved member of the Bulldog family, Akeem Hebron," Georgia football said in a statement.

"His dedication to Georgia Football will always be remembered. We send out deepest condolences to his family and loved ones during this difficult time."

Hebron was a member of the 2006 football recruiting class for Georgia and ultimately played in 16 games for the Bulldogs during the seasons from 2008 to 2010, recording 10 stops with seven assists, including two for a loss in his senior campaign, in which he also recorded the one sack in his collegiate career.

Georgia went 24-15 during Hebron's career and won two bowl games, earning a No. 1 position in the top 25 rankings to start the 2008 campaign, finishing at No. 13 in the AP poll with a 10-3 mark and win in the Citrus Bowl.

Hebron was suspended briefly during his Georgia career, but bounced back and eventually graduated from the university with a degree in a personal turnaround that caught the attention of former Bulldogs head coach Mark Richt.

"A good thing happened to Georgia and to him," Richt said.

"The greatest thing, I think, that's happened to him is that he's grown into a man. That's one of the biggest things that college is all about. He's a good man, and he's proved that, and I'm really proud of him."

Pro Basketball Player's Fatal Heart Attack Post Forced COVID Vaccine Concern

(<u>Luis Cornelio</u>, <u>Headline USA</u>) Professional basketball player Óscar Cabrera Adames, who had previously voiced grave concerns about the COVID-19 vaccine, passed away this week after suffering a fatal heart attack, Fox News <u>reported</u> on Saturday.

Gómez, a popular sports commentator in the Caribbean country, revealed that Adames was the nephew of Hugo Cabrera, a beloved basketball player and esteemed figure in the Dominican Republic.

Adames's death comes days after CDC Director Rochelle Walensky and the Biden administration came under fire for pushing COVID vaccines despite knowing that they were not effective in preventing the spread of the Chinese-originated virus.

A YouTube channel, apparently owned by Adames himself, shows his skills in Basketball.

It remains unclear whether local authorities will investigate the sudden death of Adames.

Student Pilot Suffers Cardiac Arrest During Training Flight at Fort Novosel

A shocking incident occurred on Friday, August 18, when a student pilot went into cardiac arrest during a training flight at Fort Novosel. Despite the serious nature of the event, military officials have stated that an investigation will not be conducted.

Military watchdog site <u>TRMLX</u> reported that a student pilot who was engaged in an NOE (Nap of the earth) flight, a low altitude maneuver used by military aircraft to avoid enemy detection, suffered from cardiac arrest on August 18

During the flight, the pilot suddenly slumped over the controls. A second student pilot quickly reacted, pulling him off the controls, while the IP (Instructor Pilot) safely landed the aircraft.

Emergency measures were immediately initiated, with the second student performing CPR and the IP performing an emergency shutdown. Paramedics swiftly took over, and the student was medevacked to the hospital in Dothan, resuscitated en route with a defibrillator.

According to the news outlet, the incident will likely not be investigated because "it's being labeled as a medical event and not a "precautionary landing."

I think we all have the same suspicions. If you've been living on planet earth in the last two years and aren't aware of the abnormal amount of young Americans dropping dead, then you're one of the fortunate ones who's managed to insulate themselves from literally every external media source available. You may still be in denial about it being attributed to the COVID vaccine, and you may even be stupid enough to pin it on climate change, but you're aware that deaths are increasing nonetheless.

Instructors and cadre told a different story, however. One member of cadre told me, "yes, a student in Common Core had a heart attack. Yes, he was revived after 11 minutes." A couple of other messages echoed this statement. Then I spoke to a member of the medical response team. This person told me from start to finish, the student was gone for a total of 18 minutes. He was, indeed, revived with a defibrillator, and he factually went into cardiac arrest. This person flat out said he was dead and brought back to life.

College Basketball Star Dies at Age 23, Days Before He Was Supposed to Begin His Professional Career

A former college basketball standout has died at the age of 23 just days before he was set to embark on a professional career, according to numerous reports.

Reggie Chaney, who finished a productive career at the <u>University of Houston</u> this past season — in which he was named the 2022-23 AAC Sixth Man of the Year — reportedly died suddenly but no cause of death has been announced.

A native of Tulsa, Oklahoma, Chaney attended high school at the Findlay Prep academy in Henderson, Nevada.

After graduation, he played for two seasons for the University of Arkansas. In 2020, the 6'8" forward transferred to Houston.

During the 2022-2023 season, he started one game for the Cougars and played in 35, according to $\underline{\text{the}}$ school.

He averaged three points, 2.7 rebounds and 0.7 steals per game before he graduated. Chaney averaged 4.8 points and 3.4 points per game during two seasons with the Razorbacks as a freshman and sophomore.

Arkansas basketball operations director and former coach Matt Zimmerman expressed sadness at the player's death in comments to Whole Hog Sports.

"It's devastating news," Zimmerman said. "It breaks your heart that he's passed away at such a young age."

Zimmerman concluded, "It seems like yesterday he came on his official visit. I just can't believe he's gone already."

<u>Houston</u> head coach Kelvin Sampson also commented on Chaney in comments to Joseph Duarte with The Houston Chronicle.

"Reggie is like that penny (at the convenience store), when you need him he's there," he said.

Sampson described Chaney as his "security blanket" in comments shared by KHOU. ESPN analyst Jay Bilas said he was "shocked and saddened" to learn of Chaney's death.

According to Whole Hog Sports, Chaney was set to travel to <u>Greece</u> next week where he had signed a contract to play professional basketball.



The sports world is mourning the loss of a seemingly healthy former British Olympic athlete who passed away under unknown circumstances.

The Daily Mirror <u>reported</u> that Helen Smart, who represented Team Great Britain as a swimmer in the Olympics before becoming a teacher, died at the age of 43 on Tuesday.

The cause of Smith's demise is unknown at this time. Her family <u>described</u> the death as "sudden" and were shocked by her passing.

Smart's accolades as an athlete were absolutely sterling. E News <u>notes</u>, she had many notable accomplishments as a swimmer. Smart won the bronze medal at the Commonwealth Games in 1998 and proceeded to take home silver medals at the World and European Championships. She then qualified for the 2000 Summer Olympics in Sydney, Australia and finished 15th in 200m backstroke event.

At the time of her passing, Helen was working as the head school principal at Worsley Mesnes Community Primary School in Wigan.

According to the Daily Mail, Helen's family were at a large cottage on the banks of Lake Coniston at the time of her passing. Helen was found <u>unresponsive</u> in her bed Tuesday morning at 4 AM by her four-year-old daughter Heidi.

Caleb White, 17-year-old No. 3 high school basketball player in Alabama, dies after collapsing on court

Katherine Donlevy Aug. 11, 2023

The No. 3 high school basketball player in Alabama died Thursday after collapsing on the court while playing the game he loved. Pinson Valley High School senior Caleb White, 17, became ill around 1:15 p.m. while training with his teammates, according to his grandfather.

He suddenly dropped to the ground and was rushed to the hospital, but doctors couldn't revive him, George Varnadoe Jr. said on Facebook.

"At 17, he was dead!!!" Varnadoe wrote, adding that his grandson was an "honor student, very respectful, high intellect, excellent role model, phenomenal basketball player."

"Our whole family was really looking forward to his upcoming senior season and afterwards, playing for a D-1 school and then perhaps the NBA. But....it wasn't meant to be," the grieving grandfather added.

"You see, everything that happens, happens on time, because God wouldn't allow it to happen, if it wasn't on time. And so it was with Caleb. We all have an appointment with God, one that you can't reschedule."

Varnadoe said his grandson suffered cardiac arrest, but the Jefferson County Coroner has yet to determine a ruling, <u>AL.com</u> reported.

Pinston Valley High School Principal Michael Turner announced White's death in a note sent to parents confirming the student had suffered a "medical emergency" at school before being pronounced dead at the hospital.

The 6-feet tall rising senior was a first-team all-state player for his Pinson Valley team and was one of three finalists for Class 6A player of the year as a junior, according to the Alabama High School Athletic Association.

Caleb was the No. 3 player in the state and No. 43 in the country, according to rankings by ESPN.

He was both a shooting guard and a point guard and was set to serve as the team's captain for his final year at the school.

"Our thoughts and prayers go out to Caleb's family, his classmates and basketball team and extended school family," AHSAA Director Alvin Briggs said in a statement.

"He was an outstanding student-athlete who played in the North-South All-Star Basketball Game last month. He was an outstanding student-athlete and role model."

Caleb is the latest in a string of young athletes to collapse and die during strenuous activity.

Last month, Long Island high school football player Robert Bush went into cardiac arrest just four minutes after taking the field for summer workout drills.

A 12-year-old New Jersey boy suffered the same fate in February after dropping during a game of no-contact football.

His family blasted the league running practice for neglect, claiming none of the coaches knew CPR.



Long Island high school football player Robert Bush taken off life support after collapse: report

A Long Island <u>high school football player</u> who collapsed during summer workout drills has been taken off life support, according to his family.

Robert Bush, 17, of Selden, went into cardiac arrest after just four minutes on the field Monday evening at Newfield High School.

His coaches desperately tried to save the teen, performing CPR and shocking him with a defibrillator, before he was rushed to Stony Brook Hospital.

The Bush family said they took Robert off life support on Friday night so his organs could be donated, <u>CBS New York reported</u>. "We're at the beginning of the final stages of my brother," Robert's sibling, Steven Bush, told the outlet. "We haven't said our goodbyes, but that's what we are preparing to do, talk about organ donation."

His teammates were able to visit him at the hospital.

The cause of the high schooler's sudden collapse remains uncertain, however, family members indicated that Robert, who was adopted, may have had an unknown hereditary condition that <u>affected his heart</u>.

The teen had never shown any previous signs of having a heart condition, his family told Newsday.

Bush had joined the football team to improve his health and conditioning, Steven said. While he was not a naturally talented player, he worked hard at his goal to make the varsity squad.

His brother said the family would jokingly refer to him as "Rudy," due to his short height, in reference to the iconic film. "He was always trying to get better and better because he was never a tall guy," his other brother, Chris, said.

Robert was adopted as a baby and was one of 10 siblings — from ages 16 to 56 — in the Bush family. The family had fostered over 300 children, according to Steven Bush.

His mother, Patricia Bush, died of cancer in 2017. His father is currently dealing with severe medical issues that have left the family to fend for themselves, Steven told Newsday.

12-year-old New Jersey boy dies during no-contact football practice

Katherine Donlevy Feb. 17, 2023

A 12-year-old New Jersey boy collapsed and died during a no-contact football practice — and his family has blasted the league as "neglectful" because none of the coaches knew CPR.

Elijah Jordan Brown-Garcia, a sixth-grade student at KIPP Rise Academy, was practicing with the Essex County Predators last Friday when he dropped to the ground and became unresponsive, his family told News 12.

"No contact. It was just drills running back and forth. He didn't get hit," his mother, Raven Brown, told the outlet. "He was a healthy kid...I don't know why Friday night was his day."

Elijah's 10-year-old brother, who was also at the practice, called their mother to tell her that the coaches — none of whom were CPR-certified — were trying to revive the young player.

"He said, 'They are pouring water on him, and they are fanning him.' And that's when I got my kids together and I said, 'I'm on my way," says Brown.

Brown called an ambulance as she rushed to the field, and coaches also called twice, but Brown made it to her son before emergency personnel.

She said it took 30-40 minutes for the ambulance to arrive. Elijah was rushed to the hospital, where he died. The next day, Elijah's coach called Brown to apologize.

"'Sorry, none of us are CPR-certified," the coach allegedly told the grieving mother.

New Jersey state law requires at least one person to be CPR-certified at state school events and to have a defibrillator on standby.

"They are neglectful. You can't run a team like that," Brown says,

Brown and her family are considering taking legal action against the group that runs the football league, she said. The team acknowledged Elijah's passing, but didn't provide a comment to News 12 because of an ongoing investigation.

Officials are still looking into Elijah's cause of death.

His mother said Elijah had never had any prior health issues and had gone to school earlier in the day without problems. Playing on the football team was his favorite thing to do, his mother said.

Wikipedia Suppresses Basketball Player's Post-Vaccine Blood Clot Troubles

In spring 2021, the American basketball player Brandon Goodwin, then of the Atlanta Hawks, developed severe fatigue and back pain, which would force him to miss that year's NBA playoffs. Several months later, in September, Goodwin revealed in a Twitch stream that he had been diagnosed with blood clots and that his problems began in the immediate aftermath of being vaccinated against COVID-19.

"I was fine... until I took the vaccine," Goodwin said. "I was fine... Yes, the vaccine ended my season, one thousand percent." Astonishingly, however, Brandon Goodwin's post-vaccine troubles with blood clots have been entirely purged from <a href="https://link.nis.org/link.nis

It was in fact his employer, the Atlanta Hawks, that had announced in May that Goodwin would miss the playoffs due to a "minor" respiratory condition, as reported by the Associated Press. In his September 29th Twitch stream, however, Goodwin revealed not only that he had in fact been suffering from post-vaccine blood clots, but also that a Hawks official called him while in the hospital and told him, "Don't say anything about it, don't tell nobody".

For an account of the episode, see <u>Megan Redshaw's article at Children's Health Defence</u>. The Twitch stream is no longer available, but relevant excerpts have been <u>preserved by the Daily Caller</u>.

Despite back-and-forth among Wikipedia editors about whether blood clots should be described as a 'known', 'rare' or 'common' side effect of COVID-19 vaccines, <u>as of February 26th 2022</u>, Goodwin's Wikipedia entry still included the following passage:

On October 3rd 2021, with his season having ended early, Goodwin reported severe fatigue coupled with extreme back pain, and a formal diagnosis of blood clots followed. Blood clots is a common side-effect connected to COVID-19 vaccination. Goodwin has made public he had received a vaccination shot just prior to his blood clot diagnosis.

By two days later, there was no longer any mention of his blood clots or the vaccine.

A Wikipedia editor attempted to justify an earlier deletion of reference to Goodwin's post-vaccine blood clots by noting that Goodwin had "recanted" his claims. The term is well chosen.

By the time of his Twitch stream, Goodwin had been let go by the Atlanta Hawks. In an apparent attempt to get back in the good graces of the NBA, on October 14th – the very day he signed a non-guaranteed contract with the New York Knicks and just before the start of the NBA season – Goodwin posted <u>an exculpatory tweet</u> insisting:

I don't have a story. That wasn't something I wanted to get out there. I got sick. Maybe it was the vaccine maybe it was Covid [I don't know] I'm not a expert. But I'm fine, and I'm healthy and about to play.

It was presumably also around this time that Goodwin made his Twitch stream private. He is presently out of the league. Have other NBA players likewise been put under pressure to cover up adverse reactions to a COVID-19 vaccine? Well, on the same day that Brandon Goodwin posted his exculpatory tweet, Brooklyn Nets centre Nic Claxton revealed after a pre-season game that he was feeling unwell with what the *New York Post* would later call a "mystery illness". Claxton would not play again for the next month-and-a-half.

News reports described symptoms of fatigue reminiscent of the problems Goodwin was having earlier in the year. On October 31st, the Brooklyn Nets <u>announced</u> that Claxton was suffering from an otherwise unspecified "non-Covid-related illness". "Nic is going to be out a little bit," then Net coach Steve Nash explained:

He's not feeling well. Nothing to be concerned with but I don't think he's going to be back in the next week or 10 days. Just an illness, but it's nothing major or nothing we're overly concerned with. It's just a little more severe illness than we thought initially and I think he'll miss a little more time.

Mysterious indeed. "Don't say anything about it, don't tell nobody"?

DILLON, S.C. — Dillon County Sheriff Douglas "Humbunny" Pernell died suddenly at his home Monday, according to the Dillon County Coroner's office.

Pernell, 61, worked Monday and didn't seem to have any problems before he collapsed in his home, Dillon County Coroner Donnie Grimsley said.

Pernell's deputies and other law enforcement officers escorted the sheriff's body to Myrtle Beach for an autopsy and then back to Dillon County, the sheriff's office said. Myrtle Beach is 60 miles (96.56 kilometers) southeast of Dillon.

Grimsley will review the autopsy results before releasing a cause of death.

Pernell worked in law enforcement for more than 30 years. He was elected Dillon County sheriff in 2020. Under state law, Chief Deputy Larry Abraham will act as sheriff until the governor can appoint a new sheriff leading up to a special election.


